Dear Friends in Christ:

As Christians it is fair to say that our lives, from those in the world, look like we are in a constant state of contradiction. Take for example what St. Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 16:14 "Let all that you do be done in love." The world does not see it as loving when Christians call sin a sin, but we also know that this is what the Lord has called us to do, as He tells us in Colossians 3:5-10 "5 Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. 6 On account of these the wrath of God is coming. 7 In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. 8 But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. 9 Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices 10 and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator." This is just one of many passages throughout the Bible that call for a change in our lives that is only possible when it is done by the Holy Spirit, who leads us to faith in Jesus Christ. This is the only way that anything that St Paul's says makes sense. Because before the Lord transformed us, taking us from sin to life in Jesus, we know that even as the world works now that is also the way that we thought as we were born in sin as everyone else. We didn't know what sin was because we were living in it, yes, the Law is written on our hearts, and it does convict us, but if there is no knowledge of the Lord and what He has done for us, then it is very easy for us to run right over those guilty feelings and write them off as something other than what they are. In the eyes of the world, it is all about me and how I feel about something. That is the world's mindset, which is why the world hates to hear correction from Christians, because we sound judgy rather than as a voice of truth and blessing from the Lord. Again, St Paul write this to the Church in Ephesians 4:20-24 "20 But that is not the way you learned Christ!— 21 assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus, ²² to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, 23 and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness." It does cause us pain as believers to know that we have been given the hope that the world so needs and even desires, but they are not willing to receive it because of stubbornness of sin, which is why Jesus reminds us of what we are going to be up against in our lives as believers in John 15:18-19 18 "If the world hates you, know that it has hated me before it hated you. 19 If you were of the world, the world would love you as its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you." As we move through the season of Lent and end this month with the celebration of our salvation in Christ's resurrection. we pray that the Lord would continue to use us to proclaim truth, even when it is not wanted, that others will come to that same knowledge of the resurrection leaving behind death and by the power of the Holy Spirit choosing life.

Continuing Twelve Steps for Parent in Pain, by Lee Ezell, this month Steps Nine and Ten are shared giving two more coping strategies to help parents improve their parenting skills.

Step Nine. Make amends to your children for the past through conversation, improved performance, and any restitution you may feel necessary. During this process, it's important to remember not to overcompensate, which is always a temptation when we're really sorry for something we've done to a person we dearly love. As we make amends with our children, since we will be spending the rest of our lives with them, it is wise to focus on enjoying better tomorrows rather than mourning unhappy yesterdays.

Step Ten. Keeping your past patterns in mind, stay on top of your behavior, and quickly deal with relapses into old, unhealthy habits.

The older we get, the more entrenched our habits become. Nobody's perfect, and we're bound to backslide now and then as we try to form better relationships with our sons and daughters. Don't expect perfection of yourself, or of your children. On the other hand, don't hesitate to get back on track.
