Dear Friends in Christ:

This month we are going to continue looking at how "the entire teaching about God's purpose, counsel, will, and ordination belongs to our redemption, call, justification, and salvation." (Concordia, the Lutheran Confession Pg 605) This is how it is best that Christians deal with the doctrine of election that we have been studying these last five months. Which is why in point six that we will be looking at this month the authors go to great lengths to emphasize the Lord's loving work for those that are His. They convey that message here in point six, "He also will protect them in their great weakness against the devil, the world, and the flesh. He will rule and lead them in His ways [Deuteronomy 8:6], raise them again when they stumble [Proverbs 4:11–12], comfort them under the cross and in temptation [2 Corinthians 1:3–5], and preserve them for life eternal [John 12:25]."

The challenge with any writing is to be sure that you have concisely written your message so that it will stand up to the test of time. Which is why the Book of Concord, the beliefs of confessional Lutherans, has stood the test of time, over these almost 450 years. You really cannot go wrong when you have such great source material, such as the Bible for the foundational teachings of your Church.


Look at some of the key words from point six, protect, rule, lead, raise, comfort, and preserve. All of those things that the Lord does is not because we deserve it, or have bargained for them, or for any other reason than that we are His people through the shed blood of Jesus. Everything that happens in our lives, from our own sin to when we are sinned against, is caused by, as they have been dubbed the unholy Trinity, the devil, the world, and our flesh! Which, I know we have to leave room for God's action also, but that is the point of point six, since we are God's people then everything that point six states is God's activity in the lives of His people.

So, we come to the prime question that we dealt with months ago, "how do I know that I am one of the elect?" This is where we have to give thanks to the Lord for the clarity of His word. First, how many people does the Lord want to die apart from Him? Paul writing to Timothy says the answer shouldn't be a shock to us, for he writes in 1 Timothy 2:4 that the Lord is the one "...who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." (ESV) If this is His desire then He must have put into place the means by which we are to be saved. It's almost too good to be true, but it is true. God did have a plan for salvation for all, and it's the same plan then as it is for now. This is how Paul describes it in 1 Corinthians 15:3-4, "³ For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures..." (ESV) How do we know that we are the elect of God? Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ!!! He is our certainty, our hope, our protection, and our strength.


